1) Veda is a *pramāņam*.


2) All that is here is only *İśvara*.

This he brought out in his characteristic style in his various talks.

To quote Swamiji himself --

"The Vedic vision of God is a whole vision. And the truth is that there cannot be many versions of God. Like the fact that one plus one equals two, the truth about the nature of God is not open for accommodation. The Veda tells me, "All this, whatever moves in the world, is to be [understood as] pervaded by Īśvara," īśāvāsyam idam sarvam yat kiñcana jagatyām jagat." "All that is here is Īśvara," is the opening sentence of the īśāvāsya upanişad.

The Veda is not saying that there is one God; it says there is only God. If



you do not see that, you have to prove that it is not true. It is not a matter of belief. When I say that all that is here is  $\bar{I}$ svara, it is something to be understood, not to be believed "
